This letter is in response to your letter dated September 16, 2020, regarding the arrest of Journalist Josie Huang.

Let me first start off by saying that the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department values the media and respects the freedom of the press. I am an advocate of responsible reporting and truly believe in transparency.

With regard to the arrest of Ms. Huang, it is unfortunate this incident took place during a time in which our focus was on the horrific attempted assassination of two of my deputy sheriffs. As you can imagine, the events during this time were tense and rapidly evolving. At the location where the incident occurred, my personnel were dealing with protesters who were chanting for my deputies to die. Unfortunately, Ms. Huang became part of the problem by inserting herself too close to the situation.

An internal investigation has been opened into this matter and appropriate administrative action will be taken. This case will still be presented to the Los Angeles County District Attorney's office for filing consideration.
